This prize recognises the growth in the application of data innovation in policy evaluation and celebrates the opportunities this emerging field continues to create

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA*

- Open to individuals or teams in any area of evaluation
- Applicants must be able to demonstrate innovative contributions that they as an individual or team have made in relation to the application of data analytics in evaluation. This may include innovative development/use of one or more of the following:
 - **1. Data Sources** e.g., remotely-sensed data, satellite imagery, social media data, web scraping
 - **2. Analytical Methods** e.g., geospatial analysis, natural language processing, sentiment analysis, machine learning, predictive analysis
 - **3. Dissemination of Results** e.g., interactive visualisations and dashboards

APPLICATION PROCESS

Applications should include:

- Your evaluation career history (max 250 words)
- The rationale for your application (500 words) including:
 - 1. Clarity on the category/categories of innovative development/use (1-3) upon which your application is based
 - 2. A succinct explanation about the projects/activities/action you are putting forward
 - **3.** What has changed as a result, how and why
 - **4.** An account of the specific contribution/s you made to the projects/activities/action
- Evidence to demonstrate the contributions you have made and the resultant impact, including references

*Please note that previous UKES prize winners are not eligible to apply, and all applicants must be UKES members



Early Career Evaluator - Prize Description



This prize recognises early career evaluators who have made a significant contribution to evaluation

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA*

- Open to early career evaluators in any area of evaluation
- Applicants must demonstrate they have a maximum of five years of evaluation experience
- Applicants must be able to demonstrate at least one of the following:
 - **1. Impactful Work**: major contribution to evaluations that have had a transformational change on policy or society
 - **2. Effective Use of Evaluation Approaches**: in a way that (through your application) has notably increased the quality and robustness of evaluation findings
 - **3.** Furthering Evaluation within a Particular Sector: helping to embed evaluation practice and an understanding of its value within a particular sector
 - **4. Capability Building**: supporting the development of evaluation skills within a particular sector

APPLICATION PROCESS

Applications should include:

- Your evaluation career history (max 250 words)
- The rationale for your application (500 words) including:
 - 1. Clarity on the eligibility category (1-4) upon which your application is based, including information to show how your inputs led you to select the relevant category
- **2.** A succinct explanation about the projects/activities/action you are putting forward
- **3.** What has changed as a result, how and why
- **4.** An account of the specific contribution/s you made to the projects/activities/action
- Evidence to demonstrate the contributions you have made and the resultant impact, including 1-2 references

*Please note that previous UKES prize winners are not eligible to apply, and all applicants must be UKES members

Innovation in Methodologies - Prize Description



This prize recognises individuals or teams that have introduced effective novel thinking with respect to methods, to the evaluation profession

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA*

- Open to individuals or teams in any area of evaluation
- Applicants must be able to demonstrate the contributions that they as an individual or team have made in relation to at least one of the following:
 - **1.** Enhancing/bringing together existing techniques
 - **2.** Developing novel methods
 - 3. Using new technology
 - 4. Applying learning from another discipline
 - **5.** Bringing new thinking/insights to an existing issue

APPLICATION PROCESS

Your/your team's application should include:

- Your/the team's evaluation career history (max 250 words)
- The rationale for your application (500 words) including:
 - 1. A succinct explanation of the specific methodological innovation or novel thinking you/the team are putting forward
 - **2.** What has changed as a result, how and why
 - **3.** An account of the specific contribution you/the team made to the projects/activities
- Evidence to demonstrate the contributions you/the team has/have made and the resultant impact, including references

^{*}Please note that previous UKES prize winners are not eligible to apply, and all applicants (individuals and team members) must be UKES members





Assessment Criteria and Process



Each application will be judged on its individual merit and the strengths of the supporting evidence provided

ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

Applications will be assessed on the basis of the following criteria:

- Clarity of applicant's communication of achievement
- Demonstration of evidence for what you claim to have achieved
- Quality of innovation (in what way is it innovative)
- Support from 1-2 credible referees
- Scale of impact
- Depth of impact

Please note that any applications that exceed the prescribed word limits will be assessed on the basis of the initial 250/500 words provided in each section. Any excess content will not be considered.

ASSESSMENT PANEL AND PROCESS

- The assessment panels will comprise both Ipsos UK or RSM UK
 Evaluation Directors and UKES Council Members
- The prizes will be awarded to the individual or team assessed as best overall within the relevant prize category
- In the event that no applications in a prize category meet the required standard, no prize will be awarded in that category





Timeline and Submission Process



Each application will be judged on its individual merit and the strengths of the supporting evidence provided

APPLICATION AND ASSESSMENT TIMELINE

- Application deadline Wednesday the 26th of July
- Prize winners notified end of September
- Announcement of prizes at the UK Evaluation Society Conference in October

- All applications should include:
 - Name of main applicant/s and the organisation/s they are affiliated with
 - E-mail contact address
 - Title of submission
 - Confirmation that the applicant/s hold current UK Evaluation Society membership
- Confirmation of receipt of your application will be provided
